Limited Emergency Levy Has Expired!

At the August 13, 2008 board meeting the Kalida Board of Education passed a resolution to allow the Limited Emergency Levy, originally passed in 1993 and renewed every five years, to expire at the end of the 2007 tax duplicate. When the district residents passed the income tax issue in 2005 the school board promised to allow this levy to expire. In keeping with that promise this levy will no longer be collected. High School Construction

The high school project is moving along and things are going really well. Almost all of the interior floors will be poured by the end of the month and painting has started in the band room, weight room and some areas in the main academic wing of the high school. Elementary Construction Levy

On February 3, the Kalida Local School District will have a bond issue on the ballot for the purpose of constructing a new elementary building. The school district received a \$2.1 million credit from the Ohio School Facilities Commission when they changed our Master Plan from a two building plan to a one building plan. This money has been deposited in a money market account by the school district. The district needs your permission to use this money to help fund our construction project and that is the reason for the bond issue. The February 3, 2009 bond issue will be collected for approximately six years and while that issue is being collected, the 2002 bond issue will not be collected resulting in no increase in taxes for our district residents. This money can only be used for construction of the elementary building project and in no way affects our operating budget. College Career Day

On Thursday, February 12 we will be having a college/career day for juniors attending classes at the high school. The purpose of the day will be to engage students with activities and guest speakers that will, hopefully, help each student to gain insight about him/her in regards to personality and interests and how these relate to choosing a career. The name in parenthesis represents the institution that is sponsoring the session. The career component will consist of the following three sessions which will take place in the morning:

Session I - Interpretation of ASVAB results

On January 20, juniors will take the Armed Services Vocational Battery (ASVAB). The ASVAB is a very good career assessment because it tests students in eight different areas which produce career exploration scores for verbal skills, math skills, and science/technology skills. Then, these scores can be used to link students to possible career choices.

Session II - Personality Assessment (Toledo University)

This session will focus on the personality relevance to careers. Each student will take a personality assessment and, then, have his/her personality type linked to possible career choices. The goal of sessions I and II is to find matches or careers which are revealed from both assessments.

Session III - Multimedia Career Presentation (Brown Mackie) This session will focus on current hot careers. The afternoon sessions will focus on college expectations and the college environment. The goal of these sessions is to focus on college experiences that build awareness needed for college success.

Session IV - College Dangers (Owens Community College)

This session will focus on the potential negative influences of which students could be exposed while on a college campus in the hopes of making our students aware of them in order to keep them safe.

Session V - College Life (James A. Rhodes St. College)

This session will focus on what it may be like arriving on campus as a college freshman. In addition, students will get information on terminology and services that are important in the college search process.

Vantage Applications

On Wednesday, December 3 representatives from the Vantage Career Center made a presentation to the entire sophomore class at Kalida High School. All sophomores have visited the Vantage Career Center to obtain information on two programs of their choice. Applications for next year's enrollment were distributed on this day. Any sophomore who wishes to be considered for enrollment at Vantage for the 2009-10 school year should complete the application and turn it in to the Kalida High School guidance office by Friday, January 23.

COSI Presents

The "Surgical Suite: Total Knee Replacement" Videoconference will be held on January 28. Kalida High School will connect with up to 6 other schools and an audience at COSI in Columbus to experience a LIVE total knee replacement. Grades 7-12 will have the opportunity to view this LIVE surgery with parental permission. This unique learning experience allows students to ask questions and interact via videoconference with surgeons and medical personnel in a real hospital operating room.

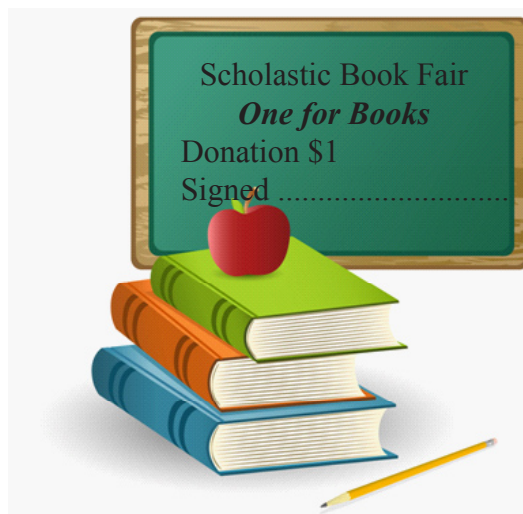
