

Freshmen Orientation- Freshmen Orientation will be held on February 5, at 6 PM, in the high school auditeria for parents and students of this year's 8th grade class – the class of 2024. It is important that students and parents both attend this event so that information can be given that is relevant for the child's academic future and success. Graduation requirements which will impact this class, course scheduling, and exciting programs for high school students will be discussed.

<u>High School Scheduling</u>- Registration for course scheduling for students entering grades 10-12 next year will take place on Thursday, February 6, during the school day. A parent signature is required on the student's scheduling form. Completed schedule forms must be returned by Friday, February 14.

College Credit Plus/AP Meetings - On Monday, February 10, at 6:00 PM, there will be a meeting in the auditeria for the parents of high school students who may be interested in taking college level courses during next school year. There are two main options at Kalida High School for students to take college level courses. One option is that students can take a few at Kalida High School. These courses are either taught by a college instructor or members of our KHS staff who have been approved by James A. Rhodes State College to teach respective courses. The following courses at Kalida High School are high school courses which can be taken for college credit through Rhodes State College: Psychology, Computer Applications, Introduction to Engineering, Digital Electronics, and Computer Aided Drafting. It is important for parents of students planning to take any of these courses for college credit attend the meeting at 6:00. If parents have attended this session in a previous year, then, there is no need to attend again. The other main method by which high school students can take college level courses is for them to take them on a college campus or online during the summer or school calendar year. A representative from James A. Rhodes State College and other local colleges will be present to explain the options of the College Credit Plus program and answer questions. Parents who attended this meeting in the past do not have to attend again, but certainly can for a refresher.

AP Course Sessions - There will be meetings on Monday, February 10, beginning at 6:45 PM at Kalida High School for students and parents of the students who will be taking any Advanced Placement (AP) course next year. These are courses which can also earn students college credit upon completion of the AP exams which are given at the end of each school year. AP courses offered at Kalida include the following with the grade level required for participation in parenthesis: American History (10, 11, 12), Government (11, 12), and English (12). For convenience, these meetings will begin at approximately 6:45 PM and will follow the above mentioned College Credit Plus session since many parents may need to attend both. The schedule for the meetings is as follows pending the completion of College Credit Plus meeting:

AP American History & AP Government (6:45 PM) - Mr. Gerding's room AP English Literature and Composition (7:00 PM) - Mrs. Gerding's room

In Search of Buckeye Boys and Girls State Delegates - All juniors have the opportunity to complete an application for Buckeye Boys' or Girls' State. At the American Legion Buckeye Boys' State and American Legion Auxiliary Buckeye Girls' State, participants are exposed to the rights, privileges, duties, and responsibilities of a franchised citizen. Students will learn about city, county and state government processes. Delegates are selected by our local American Legion Posts and Units to attend the weeklong event. Buckeye Boys' State is held on the campus of Miami University. Girls' State is held at the University of Mount Union in the summer. This is a great honor and boost to your child's resume.
