Mark Czubik is retiring after 32 years as the only boys' varsity



soccer coach in Kalida High School history. He compiled a 406-127-79 record, winning 12 Putnam County League titles, eight PCL coach of the year awards, 12 district championships and a pair of regional titles, resulting in state final four berths in 2001 and 2002. In addition, Coach Czubik was district and state Coach of the Year in 2001, and has earned numerous awards for his integrity and sportsmanship over the years.

"I have enjoyed the experience immensely," Coach Czubik said. "I couldn't have asked for a better situation."

The entire Kalida community wants to congratulate Coach Czubik for his years of service and commitment to building up and maintaining the level of excellence in the soccer program at Kalida. Coach Czubik set high standards each season for his teams and the consistency and winning his teams did over the years shows how respected he was by his players. A ceremony will be held during soccer season later this year to commemorate his many accomplishments.

How Can We Help Our Children Learn to Read?

This question is often asked by parents and educators. We all know how important it is to learn to read and to learn at an early age. The best way to begin is to make sure we are reading to our children. How early should we start? The answer is as infants. It is never too early. (However if your child is older, now is better than never starting.) One of the best pieces of literature to read to young children is the nursery rhymes. The nursery rhymes have gotten somewhat lost in the hustle and bustle of our modern society. Their value, however, cannot be duplicated. Experience and research show that nursery rhymes can benefit children in these ways:

Introduce the child to language patterns Help learn easy recall Develop speech (language) and articulation Develop phonemic awareness Build memory Understanding basic concepts such as position words Encourages creativity and listening skills

Numerous research studies have shown that children who know and can say or sing nursery rhymes by the age of 4 are usually the best at reading and spelling by age 8.



Freshmen Orientation

Freshmen orientation will be held the evening of February 24 at 6 p.m. in the high school for parents and students of this year's 8th grade class – the class of 2025. It is important that you and your child attend this event so that information can be given to you that is relevant for your child's academic future and success. Graduation requirements which will impact this class, course scheduling, and exciting programs for high school students will be discussed.

High School Scheduling

Registration for course scheduling for students entering grades 10-12 next year will take place February 25-26 during the school day. A parent signature is required on the student's scheduling form. Completed schedule forms must be given to each student's respective English teacher by March 5.

College Credit Plus/AP Meetings Scheduled

On Monday, March 1 at 6:00 p.m. there will be a meeting for the parents of high school students who may be interested in taking college level courses during next school year. There are two main options at Kalida High School for students to take college level courses. One option is that students can take a few at Kalida High School. These courses are either taught by a college instructor or members of our KHS staff who have been approved by James A. Rhodes State College to teach respective courses.

The following courses at Kalida High School are high school courses which can be taken for college credit through Rhodes State College: Psychology, Computer Applications, Introduction to Engineering, Digital Electronics, and Computer Aided Drafting. It is important for parents of students planning to take any of these courses for college credit attend the meeting at 6:00. If parents have attended this session in a previous year, then, there is no need to attend again. The other main method by which high school students can take college level courses is for them to take them on a college campus or online during the summer or school calendar year. A representative from James A. Rhodes State College and other local colleges will be present to explain the options of the College Credit Plus program and answer questions. Parents who attended this meeting in the past do not have to attend again, but certainly can for a refresher.

Buckeye Boys and Girls State Delegates

In the next few weeks juniors will have the opportunity to complete applications if interested for Buckeye Boys' and Girls' State. Young men and women around Ohio will be learning about city, county and state government processes. At American Legion Buckeye Boys State and American Legion Auxiliary Buckeye Girls State, participants are exposed to the rights, privileges, duties, and responsibilities of a franchised citizen. High School juniors are selected by local American Legion Posts and Units to attend the weeklong event. Buckeye Boys State is held on the campus of Miami University and Girls State is held at the University of Mount Union.

Vantage Information for Sophomores

The field trip for sophomores to Vantage, which is normally held in late January, has been postponed until the week of March 22. Prior to this field trip, Vantage will be hosting a virtual student/parent meet and greet and question/answer sessions on the evening of February 22. More information on accessing this virtual meeting will be released a few days before the event.

Vantage representatives were present at KHS on Wednesday, January 20 and made a presentation to all sophomores. Any sophomore who wishes to be considered for enrollment at Vantage for the 2021-22 school year should complete the application. Applications must be completed online.
