#### CALAMITY DAYS AND WINTER WEATHER - THINK SPRING!

We would like to send out a special thank you to Ken Stechschulte, Red Bellmann and Gary Vorst for all of their hard work on trying to keep up with snow removal this winter. It has been a much more traditional winter after several years with relatively mild temperatures and snowfall amounts. We would also like to thank all of our bus drivers as they work diligently to get the students to school and back home safely. It has been a very long winter, and most of us are eagerly anticipating spring.

With all of the winter weather, the district has used a large number of calamity days this year. While there is legislation in both the Ohio House and Senate which may offer additional days, the district is making plans based on the current law. The Ohio House of Representatives has passed House Bill (HB) 416, legislation adding four calamity days and allowing up to 30 minutes to be added to the school day to make up lost time at local boards' discretion. As of now, school will be in session for students on April 17 & 21, and May 23, 27 and 28.

Senator Randy Gardner (R-Bowling Green) introduced legislation recently to ensure high school graduation plans won't be disrupted by this winter's severe weather. Gardner's Senate Bill (SB) 273 says school districts will be able to keep the graduation ceremony dates they established at the beginning of the academic year and it grants local districts permission to excuse seniors from any school days added for make-up instructional time in response to snow days.

The district administration and our school board will continue to monitor the legislation regarding additional calamity days and begin to look at a plan in the event those days are available.

#### SCHOOL SAFETY TRAINING

In our continued efforts to keep the students and staff at Kalida Schools safe, our teachers will be participating in an additional A.L.I.C.E. training during our two-hour delay in-service on March 3, 2014.

A.L.I.C.E. stands for Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate and is a part of a national training program to deal with armed intruders in our buildings. After this training, our students and staff in grades 6-12 will be going through a combined one-hour training on March 27 during the school day. Mr. Pfahler will be sending more information home with the students as we approach the March 27 training date. Our goal is to ensure that the training is appropriate, informative, and helpful for the students and staff.

It is very easy to recycle STEEL, ALUMINUM, COPPER, CARDBOARD, and PAPER in Kalida. Drop off site is open 24-7 at Village Maintenance facility west of Kalida on S.R.114. Just follow instructions on signs and place aluminum, copper, cardboard & paper in semi trailers, or place steel items in roll off container.

ALL KINDS OF STEEL IS ACCEPTABLE, including refrigerators, stoves, furnaces, hot water heaters and rinsed steel food cans. Larger/heavier steel items can be placed on ground by roll off container.

ALL KINDS OF ALUMINUM IS ACCEPTABLE, specially aluminum cans. Used COPPER PIPES & WIRING can be placed in rear of aluminum trailer, as well. The more of us that recycle, the more money we can raise! It does add up! All proceeds benefit our new park now formally called "Four Seasons Park."

PLASTIC bottles & containers can be recycled at this same Kalida location, in the county's blue roll off container ONLY the first full week of every month. There is, however a full time drop off for plastic at Wal-Mart in Ottawa.
