For example, students established reading partners in other grade levels, created drawings that replicated an illustrator's artistic technique, and surpassed

With the help of Cindy Fitzgerald, KES was able to host illustrator Brian Ritter, a local ArtAbility artist, from Lima, OH. Along with his Marimor Adult Services Supervisor, Angie Herzog, a school-wide presentation of Brian's book "Winston's World" captivated our young readers. Beautifully illustrated, the story focuses on Winston, a goodhearted cat that looks a little different from the others, who overcomes obstacles to find the true meaning of friendship. Born with spina bifida, Ritter saw his share of bullying, so he truly values the friendships that he has formed along the way. The students of KES were also challenged to read 14,000 extra minutes during Read Across America Week (That's about 10 extra minutes each night for each student). NEW Student Health Requirements

The Ohio Department of Health recently approved new requirements for the immunization of school aged

children. One dose of Tdap vaccine remains required prior to entry into the 7th grade. Beginning with the start of the 2016-2017 school year, all pupils entering the 7th AND 12th grade are required to be Meningitis. One dose of Meningitis

vaccinated against Meningitis. One dose of Meningitis vaccine is required prior to entry into 7th grade with a second dose prior to entry into the 12th grade. If the incoming 12th grader has never been vaccinated against Meningitis they are required to have only one dose. However, if they were vaccinated with Meningitis before their 16th birthday, a second dose is required. It is important to note that the required Meningitis vaccine has the trade name of *Menveo* or *Menactra*. You may be hearing of another Meningitis vaccine called *Trumenba* or *Bexsero*. While these are recommended, they are not part of this new requirement. Call the Putnam County Health Department or your health care provider for more information. They take appointments every Tuesday and the fourth Wednesday mornings of each month. Avoid the back to school rush and call to schedule an appointment soon.

Students Are "e3smart"

This school year, Mrs. Grime's 8th graders are learning about energy efficiency. The Ohio Energy Project's (OEP's) e3smart program stands for energy, efficiency, and education.

The program is funded by different service territories across Ohio, including AEP Ohio. Each participating student received an energy kit which included: LED light bulbs, CFL light bulbs, a furnace filter whistle, weather stripping, a door sweep, an energy efficient shower head, faucet aerators, a flow meter bag, a hot water gauge, and a refrigerator/freezer thermometer. Students have been collecting data around school and at home. They have been learning about different types of light bulbs, insulation, heating & cooling, water heaters, and appliances. The program is designed to educate students about energy efficiency, and in turn, they can educate their parents. With parental support, students have the opportunity to put energy conservation lessons into action by installing energy-saving items provided by AEP Ohio. Once installed, these electricity and fuel-saving measures give families the opportunity to see how low-cost and no-cost measures can help lower energy usage.
