#### KALIDA ELEMENTARY MOVING TO ALL DAY KINDERGARTEN

Beginning in the 2012/2013 school year, Kalida Elementary will be implementing all day, every day kindergarten. While there is debate over half time versus full-day instruction for this age group, the time has come to develop into a full day program. The reason for full-day kindergarten should not be based on quantity alone, but rather to provide teachers and students the luxury of time – time for hands-on discovery, time for experimenting, time for reading the whole story, time for deeper, richer, more developmentally appropriate learning.

The length of the school day is only one dimension of the kindergarten experience. Our goal at Kalida Elementary is to enrich the nature of the kindergarten curriculum to better meet the demands of Ohio's new standards and to provide additional intellectually stimulating experiences, both academically and socially.

With this in mind, screening for next year's kindergarten candidates will take place on April 4. Currently, there are 46 youngsters signed up for screening. If you know of anyone else who is considering sending their child to kindergarten in 2012/2013, please have them notify Kalida Elementary as soon as possible.
