Notes from the Superintendent

The Last Quarter - Spring has arrived, and along with it a lot of new developments within the district. The spring sports season is well underway and the senior class trip has already taken place. I would like to thank the senior class advisor Mr. Dale Liebrecht and all of the adult chaperones (Ken and Doris Stechschulte, Jan Gasser, Stacy Knueve, Angie Westbeld, and Diane Kerner) for their help on the trip to New York City.

Interviews Continue - Mr. Horstman, Mrs. Myers, and many of the 7-12 teaching staff have been busy interviewing candidates for our open teaching and guidance positions. Hopefully, all of these positions will be filled at the conclusion of this month's board meeting. We are very excited about the number of quality applicants that want to work for the Kalida School System.

Graduation 2006 - Our first Commencement in the new gymnasium will be held on Sunday, May 28 at 2:00 P.M. The new facility will provide plenty of comfortable seating in a climate controlled environment. Rain or shine, it promises to be a very nice ceremony. Congratulations to the Class of 2006!

School Funding - The district was notified in the latter part of last month by the Ohio School Facilities Commission that we are not scheduled to receive funding for next year. There is still a chance that we could be contacted in May, but it is more likely that we will be eligible in the fall of 2008. If the district makes it on the "Next Ten" lists in May, we will be guaranteed funding in 2008. In my opinion, this is an ideal scenario that would provide a definite timeline for logistical planning. I will continue to update all residents of the district of our status as we progress forward.

The Class of 2019 - Kindergarten enrollment for next year has bounced back a bit and we currently have 50 students registered. This is great news for the district, as our enrollment plays a significant role in funding and in facilities planning. Mr. Lammers will be making some slight adjustments in the elementary teaching staff to accommodate the fluctuation in numbers at each specific grade level.

Enrollment - Enrollment is directly related to district finances, and the board has committed to making the appropriate personnel changes to address fluctuations in enrollment as they occur. I assure you that we will be looking at staffing levels of both certified and non-certified personnel on an annual basis in order to maintain long term fiscal responsibility.

Weight Room Update - The weight room committee is in the final stages of completing the project to transform the former cafeteria into a very nice weight room/fitness facility. Thank you to all of the athletic boosters and the volunteers who assisted in getting the room ready. The walls have been painted and the rubber floor is on site awaiting installation. The fitness equipment is scheduled for delivery at the end of this month.

Boys Basketball Meeting

There will be a meeting of interested basketball players and their parents from grades 8-11 on Wednesday, April 26, in the KHS small gym at 8:30 PM. Coach Kortokrax will answer questions or concerns about the Boys' Varsity, Junior Varsity and possible Freshmen teams. Off-season and summer activities with these future teams will also be addressed.

Also to be discussed is the **commitment** expected from players who would like to be a part of these programs. All parents and players are encouraged to attend. Other interested players and adults are welcome as well.

Vantage Competition


