Noah Hermiller Receives State FFA Degree

This May, the Ohio FFA Association awarded over 800 State FFA Degrees to members from all across the state. Kalida FFA proudly had our president and KHS senior, Noah Hermiller, receive this honor.

The State FFA Degree requires a member have at least 25 hours of community service, participate in at least 8 different FFA activities above the chapter level, compete in at least two Career Development Events, have a minimum of a 3.0 grade point average, and productively invest or earn \$2,500 in their respective Supervised Agricultural Experience project. This is the highest degree a FFA member can earn at the state level and we extremely proud to add Noah to our list of prestigious members with this honor.
