✓ Site work continues to move forward. Although delayed by recent rains, work should easily be completed in time for construction to begin. During a May 5 meeting with O.S.F.C., the Early Site Package was approved for co-funding between O.S.F.C. (75%) and Kalida Local (25%).

✓ During the May 5 meeting, the Schematic Design Phase and the Design Development Phase plans were also accepted by O.S.F.C.

# ~ History of State and Local Revenues ~ notes compiled by Treasurer Cindy Webken

Many people have been asking why it seems some school districts are always asking local residents for more money through tax levies. **One contributing factor to this is the dwindling of state money toward education.** In districts where the state share of basic aid continues to decline, the burden of funding existing or new educational programs is shifted to local residents. As state aid declines, one option for school districts is to ask residents for additional revenue so they may continue their current levels of service to students. As you can see by the following table, the state share by percentage for Kalida Schools continues to decrease.

# Kalida Athletics All Season Sports Pass

Available August 2

for the 2004-05 athletic year. Approved by the board in July, two-year trial basis.

The All Sports Pass will permit admittance to any Kalida home athletic contest. This includes varsity, junior varsity, freshmen and junior high contests for both boys and girls. Away contests and tournaments (including the junior high tournaments held at Kalida) are NOT included.

One concern we have with the All Sports Pass is the availability of seating in high attendance contests. An example would be a boys' varsity basketball game where the league title would be decided. The following guidelines will be followed:

• We will abide by the PCL rules and provide a specified number of tickets to the visiting school.

• We will not exceed the number of fans deemed safe for the facility as determined by the fire marshal.

• We will sell remaining seating at the start of the junior varsity contest since we have no way of knowing how many of these passes will be used for any one contest.

The Kalida Athletic Department will offer an All Sports Pass Since the purpose of the All Sports Pass is to increase attendance at contests, it seems contradictory to hold seats that 2003, the sale of these passes is now in the second year of a may or may not be filled. Please note that we have not had a "sell out" in any sport for several years.

> To summarize, the All Sports Pass does not guarantee admittance to contest where maximum capacity has been reached. Therefore, you may want to arrive early at these contests. Originally issued tickets must be presented to the ticket taker upon entrance to the gate at the game. No copies or scanned items will be accepted.

> Four categories of tickets will be sold. A family pass for \$250 will admit a husband and wife and all their children in grades K-12. A senior citizen pass for fans over 65 years of age and an individual student pass, K-12, will cost \$65. An individual adult pass will be available for \$90.

> Please note there will be an additional cost if you desire boys' varsity basketball reserved seating.

> The passes are non-transferable and may only be used by the person whose name is on the ticket. If you are interested in an All Sports Pass, please complete the ticket application and return it to the superintendent's/ treasurer's office. Tickets will be available starting August 2. Tickets will be available for pick up two working days after the application is received. For those dropping off an application in person, if time permits, tickets will be issued immediately.

Dressed in identical black Teens Against Tobacco Use (TATU)




