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Kalida Local Schools adopts a 1:1 iPad Initiative

Kalida Local Schools is pleased to announce a new technology initiative. Beginning in the 2012-13 school year, the high school students at Kalida will be provided with iPads to use in their daily schedule. These iPads will be issued just as textbooks are issued, and they will be used throughout the entire school year. The students will be able to take the iPads home on a daily basis, which will dramatically change the way and manner in which instruction is delivered. The students will have access to textbooks, manipulatives, educational Apps, and district technology tools and services around the clock.

The Kalida Local School District has been studying the possibility of a 1:1 technology initiative for almost five years. The development of the iPads and the supplemental tools provided to use with the iPads helped spur the decision to implement this initiative. This decision was also motivated by the success our staff and students have already had using the iPads. Our staff and students have been using shared iPads in the classroom with great success for the past few years.

Our students live in a digital world, altered by ever-changing technology. Whether our students are described as "Digital Natives" or "21st Century Learners", we, as educators are well aware that students today are very different from past years. This generation of 21st Century Learners can absorb a great deal of information at super-charged speed whether it is transmitted via a cell phone, television, the Internet, or MP3 player. Digital students are masters of varying types of technology and these students are always connected with their peers and the world. It is our vision at Kalida Local Schools to incorporate these 21st Century Skills into our classrooms.

The district will be leasing the iPads from Apple, and the cost of the lease will be offset through the use of two grants. The district will use funds supplied through the Rural Education Achievement Program (REAP) grant, and the Race to the Top (RttT) grant and a \$75 per student insurance charge to fund the program. The program will be voluntary, and students who choose not to participate will have the opportunity to use the iPads during the school day, but not to use at home.

The iPads will be delivered to the district during the early part of June. All iPads will be tagged and inventoried. Both teacher and student iPads will have protective cases. Many teachers have their iPads now and all will have them by the end of June.

Parent meetings are scheduled for August 7 at 7:00 PM and August 14 at 9:00 AM and 7:00 PM in the auditeria. This is a very important meeting to introduce parents to the iPad Project, to answer questions, and to sign necessary forms. Students are invited to attend, but it is required that they be accompanied by a parent. No student will receive an iPad without a parent attending the meeting and returning these signed documents. More information will be forthcom-

ing about those meetings.

Students will receive iPads during grade level meetings to be held the first week of school. Expectations and responsibilities will be discussed with students at that time.

Further updates will be coming on the school district website and we will continue to develop a "Frequently Asked Questions" section that will be updated throughout the project. ~ *Don Horstman, Superintendent*

to the health care profession!! - 10 in nursing, 4 in physical therapy, 3 in health sciences, 2 in biomedical sciences, 1 in respiratory care, 1 in healthcare administration, 1 in health information technology, 1 in premedicine, and 1 in invasive cardiovascular technology. Fifteen will be become Buckeyes at the Ohio State University on the campus in Lima or Columbus. Other destinations to the Ohio universities include the following: Wright State University, Ohio University, Toledo University, University of Cincinnati, Bowling Green State University, and Akron State University. Ten grads will be attending 2-year state schools including: James A. Rhodes State College and Northwest State College. Other schools of choice for our recent grads include: University of Findlay, Owens Technical College, The University of Northwestern Ohio, University of Dayton, Defiance College, St. Francis University (Ft. Wayne, IN), Spencerian College (Louisville, KY), and Trine University (Angola, IN).

In summary, it was another great year for a very talented senior class. This year's graduates earned or were awarded scholarships in excess of \$600,000 for their academic achievements.
