CONSTRUCTION UPDATE - The high school construction project is moving along and everyone is working hard to be ready for the first day of school on August 31. The parking lots have been started and the school bus pick-up and drop-off area should be completed by the first week in August. The main lot has had the curb installed and is being readied for concrete. Work on the sidewalks and landscaping should also begin next week so there is going to be a lot of activity around the exterior of the building. The

> district is down to a few items that need completed in the interior of the building, and the first shipments of classroom furniture should be arriving on Monday, August 3. The building will really start to look like a finished product when the chairs, tables and desks begin to be set up. It is a very exciting summer to say the least.

> The elementary project was started this week and should be moving forward as quickly as possible. The district is constructing a boiler room to maintain utilities to the church owned portion of the building during the demolition of the old academic wing. This boiler room will serve the entire project when the new building is finished next fall. Additional asbestos will need to be removed from the el-

ementary project, and we are waiting for this work to be completed so we can move forward with the boiler room. The construction portion of project will be going out to bid soon, and we are eager to get started on the new building.

DEDICATION AND OPEN HOUSE - The district is planning a building dedication and open house for Sunday, August 30. The program will start at 11:45 a.m. We will have a dedication ceremony at the new high school and the building will be open for district residents to tour after the ceremony. There will also be a dinner sponsored by the Kalida Cross Country team after the dedication ceremony. More information regarding tickets and the menu for the meal will be coming in the next week. EMERSON BURKHART - Kalida native Emerson Burkhart was featured in the July/August edition of the *Ohio State Alumni Magazine*. His work in Stillman Hall consists of a series of murals that are frescoes, created by mixing oil paints into wet plaster on the walls. Kalida High School and Middle School are busy preparing for another very exciting and successful year. Congratulations to all of the staff, students and their families on achieving the designation of Excellent for the ninth year in a row.

The most significant change to our school this year is the completion of the new high school building. After spending the last grading period in the modular classrooms, our students and staff are excited to be moving in to the new high school building this year. We welcome the sixth graders back as they had ended their school year back at the elementary building.

As we look to the future we have continued to expand our rigorous curriculum by adding an additional Advanced Placement course. Mr. Gasser will be teaching AP United States History. We have also added courses in our Project Lead The Way programs to include the third year of the Pre-Engineering program, Digital Electronics and the second year of our Biomedical program, Human Body Systems. These programs continue to help prepare our students for careers and additional education beyond Kalida High School. Our Dual Enrollment courses offerings have also expanded to include English 101 through Wright State University and Personal Finance through Rhodes State College.

These additions will provide our students with the best chance to compete for college admissions, scholarships, and employment opportunities.

This year, our sophomores will be taking the Ohio Graduation Test. Our 6th graders will be taking Achievement tests in Reading and Math; 7th graders will be tested in Reading, Math and Writing and our 8th graders will be taking Achievement tests in Reading, Math, Science, and Social Studies. Over the summer our teachers have been working to make sure that our students are prepared for these tests and continue the excellent tradition of academic success here.


