## WELCOME BACK

Kalida Local Schools started the new school year on August 21, 2013. We have had a very good first week of school, and we would like to thank the students, parents, and staff for getting off to a good start.

As the year kicks off, the district will have a number of new faces on the staff. The district has hired Kristen Stechschulte as a full time physical education teacher, and Keith Fischer as a half-time physical education teacher. Ryan McMichael is our new Vocational Agriculture Instructor at the high school. We also have two other new faces at the elementary. Mrs. Kelly Siefker is teaching third grade, and Ms. Megan Heitmeyer is working as a paraprofessonial at the elementary. Ms. Heitmeyer's position combines two classroom aide/tutor positions into one new position. She will be working with teachers and individual students to provide additional instructional support.

The district will also continue to work on new state initiatives as a part of the Race to the Top grant program. A team of teachers and administrators will work on improving instruction, enhancing our curriculum, implementing new accountability measures, and developing new evaluation tools for staff members. This work is a part of an ongoing four year grant through the Ohio Department of Education and the U.S. Department of Education.

#### ENHANCEMENT COMMITTEE PROJECTS

Kalida Local Schools would like to thank our Enhancement Committee members for a number of projects they are funding. The committee has funded additional landscaping at the high school, and this work was completed the first full week of school. The committee will also be adding a number of trees in areas around the high school to help beautify the school grounds. The trees will be planted yet this fall. The committee also provided funding for additional restroom signage in the high school gymnasium, additional wood work in the gymnasium, and they will be installing new Wildcat mascot logo panels on the scoreboards at the high school.

# What's Changing in Elementary Education?

Changes are taking place everywhere in education in Ohio and Kalida Elementary is right in the midst of them. In future editions of The Paw Print, I would like to address several areas of change in more detail and how they impact our elementary students, including New Learning Standards, Educator Evaluations, Next Generation Assessments, Third Grade Reading Guarantee and Early Childhood Improvement.

In some cases, these changes are in the third year of development and are expected to be fully implemented this year. For other areas of change, 2013 is the kickoff year and full implementation is expected by 2017.

Superintendent Horstman has already introduced the A-F School and District Report Card information to district residents. Assessments that were taken by grades 3-8 students last April impacted those reports and we performed fairly well as a building and as a district. Over the next three years, the report card will expand to 18 measures, adding mostly information derived from high school statistics.

In the next issue, I will speak in depth on the New Learning Standards and Next Generation Assessments and how they affect students in grades kindergarten through eight.
