The band performed at Dayton's Welcome Stadium on October 26 and earned a superior rating for the second year in a row. The band has now completed a trip to the state OMEA competition for the third straight year. Mrs. Klausing, Mrs. Glick and Ms. Schroeder continue to help our students meet their full potential as the band also received a superior rating in every single category to put an exclamation point on a great performance. A special thanks to our senior band members for all of their leadership and commitment to the program.

Congratulations to all of our fall sports athletes and coaches. Our student-athletes were very successful and continued to represent themselves and Kalida High School very well. We will be honoring them and recognizing their accomplishments at the Fall Athletic banquet on November 17 at 6:30 PM in the high school auditeria.

We are continuing to meet with local groups and organizations to discuss the elementary construction project and levy issue. This levy will be on the Feb. 2009 ballot and will allow the district to use money received as a credit from the Ohio School Facilities Commission to construct a new elementary building. We are simply asking the voters for permission to use money already approved in 2002 to finish the original building master plan. There will be NO SCHOOL for students on Tues., Nov. 25 or Wed., Nov. 26.Financial Aid Night for Senior Parents and Students Every year a seminar is held at one of the following area participating schools: Continental, Kalida, Ft. Jennings, and Ottoville. It is, thus, rotated yearly among the four schools. This year it will be held on Monday, December 8 @ 7 PM at Ottoville High School. A representative from a local college's financial aid department will be present to explain various types of financial aid that students may have the potential to obtain. In addition, he will explain the proper procedure for filling out the Free Application for Student Assistance (FAFSA). Parents of Juniors are also encouraged to attend if they wish to get a head start on the college process.

The FAFSA is the governmental form which must be filled out by the student and his/her parent(s) in order to determine the student's eligibility for financial aid. Many colleges and universities also require that it be filled out if a student wishes to be considered for funds that the respective schools distribute. Paper applications will be available in December, but applying online for the FAFSA is faster and more accurate. Beginning January 1 for this year's seniors, parents and students can access the application at www. fafsa.ed.gov What can you do right now? Parents and students can apply for a pin number which will be your electronic signature for the FAFSA. The student and at least one parent need a pin. You can obtain this at www. pin.ed.gov
