Kalida Connects

Discussions have been underway the past month or two regarding implementation of constructive interaction groups for Kalida students. The idea was introduced and KHS Art teacher, Mr. Steve Myers, took ownership of the proposal and developed what should be a very meaningful resource for everyone involved. The concept is to create a student-driven social organization that will contribute to a safe and enjoyable environment for all students. This platform has been named Kalida Connects and is intended to develop positive relationships across grade levels, along with expanding peer support and interactive connections between Kalida students, faculty, and staff.

Ultimately, we anticipate Kalida Connects to be run by students, for students. Kalida Connects is designed to encourage everyone to discuss pertinent social issues and share simple advice on high school or middle school topics. Groups of 12-14 students, under the mentorship of a staff member, will meet monthly. At first, the teacher will facilitate the discussion; but eventually, we see the upperclassmen in each group taking the lead. Outside of these monthly meetings, the mentor teacher will serve as a resource for team members and will provide a caring adult to follow up on the well-being and progress of each student.

Kalida Cares

Kalida Local Schools, led by Student Council and Cats Who Care, recently held a disaster relief collection for those affected by the recent hurricanes. Both Kalida High/Middle School and



Kalida Elementary students and staff collected baby care items for families with young children who are displaced and/or are in need of help due to the destruction of Hurricanes Harvey and Irma. Monetary donations were also accepted at various athletic events during September. In the High/

Middle School over 2600 diapers, 90+ bottles of baby lotion, shampoo and baby powder, and 80 containers of baby wipes were donated as well as three large boxes full of baby food, cereal, and formula. Thanks to everyone who donated to help make a Difference!

Kalida Connects is still in the planning phase. Therefore, our first Kalida Connects meeting will be conducted in mid-January. Staff members will be brainstorming ideas during parent-teacher conferences and introduce the program to students in grades 5-12 soon after that. It is designed for students in fifth grade through eighth grade in one set of groups and students in ninth grade through twelfth grade in other groups. This will allow for discussion at more grade appropriate conversation levels.

In addition to the Kalida Connects initiative, we will also be implementing Personal Education Plans (PEPs). Students in grades 5-12 will be asked to develop an educational road map of goals for themselves, including career objectives and pursuits. Our mission is to provide students with exposure, exploration, and experience to various career opportunities by personally tailoring these opportunities to students at certain stages in their education. Parents will also be a stakeholder in the process. We believe these programs support our mission statement at Kalida Local Schools – to provide a well-rounded education to prepare students for the future.


