Financial Aid Night for Senior Parents and Students

The FAFSA or Free Application For Student Assistance is the governmental form which must be filled out by the student and his/her parent(s) in order to determine the student's eligibility for financial aid. Many colleges and universities also require that it be filled out if a student wishes to be considered for funds (scholarships) that the respective schools distribute. Applying online for the FAFSA is faster and more accurate. Beginning January 1 for this year's seniors, parents and students can access the application at www.fafsa. ed.gov What can you do right now? Parents and students can apply for a pin number which will be your electronic signature for the FAFSA. The student and at least one parent need a pin. You can obtain this at www.pin.ed.gov

Every year a seminar is held at one of the following area participating schools: Continental, Kalida, Ft. Jennings, and Ottoville. It is, thus, rotated yearly among the four schools. This year it will be held on Monday, January 30 at 7 p.m. at Continental High School. Please mark this date on your calendar. A representative from a local college's financial aid department will be present to explain the proper procedure for filling out the Free Application for Student Aid (FAFSA). Parents of juniors are also encouraged to attend if they wish to get a head start on the college process. There are a couple of other financial aid nights coming up in our area. Here is a listing in case their locations and times are more convenient: December 5 (6:30 p.m.) @ Van Wert High School, December 7 (7 p.m.) @ Ottawa-Glandorf High School.

Plastic Bag Recycling

The middle school student council will once again sponsor a plastic bag recycling event. Send your bags to school and drop them in the bins near the event entrance or high school lobby. We will be collecting the bags the first two weeks in January following the Christmas break. **College Career Day** – On December 9 juniors will attend College/Career Day at the OSU-Lima/James A. Senior Scholarship Opportunities

Many local, state, and national organizations send applications or information regarding scholarships to Kalida High School. Unless specified, these scholarship opportunities are for seniors. Access the high school website (http://kalida.k12.oh.us) and move the cursor to the yellow "resources" tab. Once the choices are displayed, click on the guidance link to access a current listing of these scholarship opportunities. Once, you have clicked on the guidance link, scroll down until you see a box labeled "scholarship opportunities." Click on that box to view the scholarships - paying particular attention to the criteria which a student must possess in order to be eligible to apply. This listing will be updated at least once a month and "new release scholarships" that were not present on the previous listing will be marked in red

PSAT/PLAN - Results for juniors and sophomores who took the PSAT or practice SAT in October are due back in December. PLAN or pre-Act results for students who just tested on November 16 will arrive sometime in January.
