## **Notes from the Superintendent**

The Holiday season has officially begun as we enter the month of December. There are a host of holiday activities scheduled within the district which will begin with our participation in "Christmas in Kalida" on December 9. At 8:15 PM that evening join us as the school district hosts a showing of a family (parents and children) oriented Christmas movie in the new high school auditeria. We are inviting anyone who would like to attend. This will be the first opportunity for the community to utilize the new projector that was purchased by the Enhancement Committee and the 28' projection screen located on the stage.

The first classes were held in the new facility on Monday, November 28 and lunch was served from the new kitchen for the first time. It was very rewarding for me personally to watch the students and the staff members utilize the new facility. It is only appropriate that I once again thank the community for your continued support of the Kalida Local Schools. The move was relatively seamless over the Thanksgiving weekend thanks to the hard work of all involved. I especially want to recognize all of the teachers who relocated, Mr. Stober for his work in getting the computers on-line and fully operational, and our cafeteria personnel and Ken Stechschulte and the maintenance staff who stepped up to the plate and made the move happen as planned.

The automated cafeteria payment system is fully operational and appears to be operating quite smoothly. I have received a great deal of positive feedback from the community regarding the convenience for parents as a result of the new system. The cafeteria staff has done a great job of working through the kinks of the new system and I think we have all been amazed at how quickly the students have caught on.

The district is in the initial stages of another enrollment projection as required by the Ohio School Facilities Commission for Phase II construction. Declining enrollment continues to be a major issue facing the school district. This issue is not exclusive to Kalida as virtually the entire county is experiencing similar declines. The population of Putnam County is roughly within 100 people of what it was in 1900 and more than 60% of Putnam County residents do not have school age children. The good news however, is that we have 42 kindergarten students already enrolled for the 2006-07 school year and we are anticipating several more during Kindergarten Registration Week (December 5-9.)

# Seniors and Financial Aid Things to know

What can you do right now? Apply for a PIN number at **www.pin.ed.gov.** The student AND one or both parents need a PIN to apply online for financial aid.

Applying online is faster and more accurate. Go to **www.fafsa.ed.gov.** It's available beginning January 1 for this year's seniors.

For students already in college, all FAFSA renewals will be online. Paper applications are for first year college students only.

Watch out for rip-offs. There are other FAFSA sites that make you pay a fee. Be sure you use the address mentioned above. The first "F" in FAFSA stands for free.

A limited number of "paper" FAFSAs have arrived. We also have worksheets for the online version that are more helpful than the paper applications.

Our financial aid night is scheduled for 7 PM January 16 at Fort Jennings.

College Goal Sunday is February 12. There will be several sites in the state offering help with the FAFSA. College financial aid experts will be available to either help you with specific questions on your application or to explain the entire process.

Mrs. Myers will meet with seniors in Mr. Gasser's classes in late December to go over financial aid information. Mr. Dave Myers, Vantage counselor, will meet with Vantage seniors in December or January as well.

**ACT and SAT testing**—Students may pick up registration forms for either test in the guidance, or they may register online at www.act.org (ACT) or www.collegeboard.org (SAT). In both cases, the students will need to enter our high school code so that score reports will be sent to the high school as well as to the student. The school needs a copy of the reports in order to add the transcript results to a student's transcript. Links to both of these sites are provided on the guidance portion of the school website. Our school code is the same for either test—362765.

All Ohio schools will accept either test. There is a major scholarship program from Ohio Board of Regents that accepts only ACT scores; however, there may still be a few employer based scholarships that still require SAT scores. Parents should check with their employers to see if any scholarship programs are available at work.

Last year the big news in testing centered around the addition of a writing test to both the ACT and SAT. For the SAT, the writing test is now built in to the original test. For the ACT, it is an optional component that requires extra time and extra fees. This year's seniors will be the first group to deal with the writing test as part of their college admission requirements. Several Ohio colleges are now requiring this score. However, they want the writing score for research purposes and they are not using this score to deny admission to students. We are hearing that this is probably also true for this year's juniors, although that's not definite in all cases. There will certainly be some changes in this policy in the future, so please be on the alert.

**Kalida Wildcat Cards**-Support the junior class Post Prom and save money at the same time. The junior class is selling *Wildcat Discount Cards* to raise money for the Post Prom. Cards are \$10 each and contain discounts to over 27 businesses. Proceeds are used to provide a safe and entertaining Post Prom for our junior and senior classes. 
