#### Meet Beatriz Sarteschi Hortas

Beatriz Sarteschi Hortas enrolled in Kalida High School as an Exchange student from the seaside city of Recife, Pernambuco in the northeast part of Brazil. Her host family is Joe and Jessica Schnipke. Bea's mom, Camila Sarteschi, works in the healthcare field at a hospital and her father, Fabio Hortas, owns a window frame company. She has a 14 year old bother, Guilherme. Bea's family loves to travel and spend most weekends at their beach house.

An interesting fact about her family is that they do not have 100% Brazilian blood. Both her mother's and father's families came from European countries. Because of this, she has both Italian (on her mother's side) and Portuguese (on her father's side) blood. Much of the food she has in Brazil also

exists here, but what really makes a difference is the way it is prepared and the seasoning, which are very different. One dish she really misses is a Brazilian dessert called brigadeiro. Some of her hobbies usually involve drawing and painting. Bea also really likes reading and writing. When she was younger, Bea did several types of dance but when she got older she tried volleyball for a few years.



In Brazil, she participated in a math club and history olympiads at school. When asked why she wanted to be an exchange student Bea said "I have always been very passionate about other languages and I also always liked getting to know other places and new people, so I thought it would be a good experience for me. In addition, my father did an exchange in England at the same age as me and encouraged me a lot to come. I also intend to make another exchange to a different place in a few years." Bea's favorite subject at Kalida High School has been, by far, history and art. I really like the arts in general so it was easy to like the subject, while History has always been one of my favorite subjects. Other than that, Mr. Gerding teaches very well too, which helps a lot to easily understand the subject!

Bea's favorite part of her journey so far has been the people. She said, "Everyone has been very kind to me and I am truly happy for the amazing family that chose me. I'm also really enjoying being able to experience the



4 seasons, since where I live we only have summer. The possibility of being able to visit several places is also very exciting." We asked her what was different or surprised her about our culture here. She noted, "Many things in our cultures are different so I'll mention the ones that shocked me the most! The food here is always very processed and it even took me a while to get used to it at first. Another very funny thing I noticed around here is that people go out in pajamas to go places, something we don't do at all in my country. Before Bea leaves the United States she would like to visit New York.





Kalida Elementary will be using FinalForms, an online forms and data management service, for the 2025-26 kindergarten registration process. Please register your kindergarten student for the 2025-26 school year via this link:

You will be asked to create a NEW account if you do not currently have any students in the Kalida school system. If you already have an account, simply log in and create a NEW STUDENT.

After creating a new account, you will receive an email verifying the account. Follow all prompts to verify and enter your student's information.

Please upload a copy of a certified birth certificate and immunization record when you register. You may go in at a later date to update busing information, update immunization records and any other changes in address, phone etc. that occur between now and the start of the school year. Each online form will need to be completed and signed at the bottom. When all online forms are "green", your registration process is complete.

FinalForms allows you to complete and sign enrollment and back-to-school forms for your students. FinalForms saves the data from year-to-year, meaning that you will never need to enter the same information twice! FinalForms also pre-populates information wherever possible, for each of your students, saving you time. You may review your data at any time to verify it is current. You will be required to sign your forms once per year and after any update.

Registration for course scheduling for students entering grades 10-12 next year will take place on Thursday, February 6 during the school day. A parent signature is required on the student's scheduling form. Completed schedule forms must be given to each student's respective English teacher by Thursday, February 13.

# **College Credit Plus Meeting**

On **Monday, February 10 at 6:00 p.m.** there will be a meeting in the high school community room for the parents of high school students who may be interested in taking college level courses during next school year. There are two main options at Kalida High School for students to take college level courses. One option is that students can take a few at Kalida High School. These courses are either taught by a college instructor or members of our KHS staff who have been approved by James A. Rhodes State College to teach respective courses.

The following courses at Kalida High School are high school courses which can be taken for college credit through Rhodes State College: Psychology, Computer Applications, Personal Finance, Introduction to Engineering, Digital Electronics, and Computer Aided Drafting. It is important for parents of students planning to take any of these courses for college credit to attend the meeting on February 10. If parents have attended this session in a previous year, there is no need to attend again.

The other main method by which high school students can take college level courses is for them to take them on a college campus or online during the summer or school calendar year. A representative from James A. Rhodes State College and other local colleges will be present to explain the options of the College Credit Plus program and answer questions. Parents who attended this meeting in the past do not have to attend again, but certainly can for a refresher.






# **Art Students Decorating Competition**


