On Sunday, May 25, the Kalida High School Class of 2025 graduated 43 students. This was a tremendously talented class, which included 13 valedictorians, 1 salutatorian, 26 honor graduates who earned a 3.5 or higher grade point average, and 2 National Merit Scholarship finalists. The future endeavors of our graduates span a wide array of career interests as their selected majors in college and vocational training cover a great variety of fields and professions. Eight KHS graduates will be working full time after graduation. Thirty-three of our fortythree graduates will be attending colleges and universities not only in the Putnam County area but also throughout all regions of Ohio as well as outside the state. 



SUMMER EBT—What is it?

The Summer Electronic Benefit Transfer Program for Children (Summer EBT or SUN Bucks) began in 2024 and continues for 2025. This program provides grocery benefits to low-income families with school-aged children when schools are closed for the summer. Summer EBT benefits will either be loaded to a household's Ohio Direction Card, or a benefit card will be sent in the mail to each eligible child. Families can use the money to buy food during the summer at grocery stores, farmers markets, and other authorized retailers. Families will receive a onetime benefit of \$120 for each eligible child and participation will not affect children or families' immigration status.

How do I know if my child is eligible to receive Summer EBT/Sun Bucks and how do I apply?

Many families will get Summer EBT/SUN Bucks automatically if they are getting other benefits, but some families may need to apply for the program. If your household already participates in SNAP, OWF, or if income eligible and receiving Medicaid benefits, your child will automatically be enrolled to receive summer benefits. You do not need to fill out an application or take any further action. Similarly, households who have been approved for free/reduced meal benefits at their school will be submitted to automatically receive the summer benefit with no further action.

If you are not automatically enrolled, but you believe that your child might be eligible, you can check your income eligibility and apply for SEBT by completing an application through August 15, 2025 at: https://sebt.ohio.gov
