Supplies needed for class

Supplies needed for class

- 1 binder with pockets and loose leaf paper OR a notebook and a folder (Health)
- 5 folders with pockets (1 for Reading)
- 1 Book cover
- Blue or black pens
- Red pens
- Pencils
- Highlighters
- Colored pencils
- Ear buds to remain at school

GRADES 7-12

- Headphones to remain at school
