Notes from the Superintendent

Building News-As we begin the month of October, the construction project is beginning to wind down. The target date to fully occupy the new building is right around the corner. The Library, Cafeteria, Gymnasium, Science Classrooms, as well as the Distance Learning Room and the Computer Lab will be fully open for business when students return from the quarter break on October 31. The majority of the building is complete other than a few punch list type items which will be addressed between now and the end of October. The only substantial items left to finish include: main entrance ceiling, wooden stage floor, media center casework, and flooring in the auditeria and media center. It will be an exciting time for our students and the entire community as we begin to fully utilize the new facilities.

<u>Initiating the New Stage</u>-The KHS drama group will perform a play in the new auditeria on Nov.11-12. Show time will be at 7:30 PM each evening and all tickets will be \$5. The students are anxious to try their acting skills on the new stage. We will be announcing the play title soon as we are in the process of finalizing the paperwork to obtain show rights. Come on out and enjoy the show.

Heart Defibrillators-Kalida High School and Kalida Elementary were both awarded grants to purchase portable heart defibrillators last spring. These units will be mounted on the walls in the existing junior high/high school, St. Michael's Elementary, and the new junior high/high school, in order to provide an extra measure of safety both during the school day and during extracurricular activities. The Kalida Fire Department has been instrumental in providing the necessary training to staff members and coaches so that they will be prepared in the event of an emergency.

<u>Cafeteria Update-</u>The process of implementing an automated payment system for both cafeterias is well underway. The Kalida administration and cafeteria personnel are anticipating a much more convenient method for parents and students to purchase school lunches that will hopefully be fully operational by mid-November. This automated system will eventually eliminate the need for parents to purchase lunch tickets and offer the convenience of allowing parents to prepay for school lunches to individual student accounts. We will be sending home a separate mailing detailing this system in the near future.

State Funding for Phase Two-The district has moved up on the Ohio School Facilities Eligibility List from number 232 to 218. This list can be viewed online at: http://www.osfc.state.oh.us/. This simply means that full state funding for phase two of the building project is considerably closer than was originally anticipated. The district will be working with the OSFC in the near future to try and determine a more specific time frame for phase II of the building project. Phase II includes the completion of the new high school/junior high as well as construction of a new elementary. Hopefully, I will have more information pertaining to this project in next month's newsletter.

Learning Express Library

A new online resource available to students this year through INFOhio is the Learning Express Library.

Featured resources for school students include:

- ACT and SAT test preparation with built-in time clock.
- Advanced Placement practice tests
- Elementary skills improvement
- Middle school and high school skill-building interactive courses in Math, Reading, and Writing
- Career guidance materials including job and career test preparation

All practice tests provide students with instant diagnostic score reports, complete answer explanations, and an individualized analysis of their results.

Each student must set up an account so practice and test results can be saved. A Learning Express Library *Getting Started* handout is available in the guidance office and high school library. Check it out today!!

Technology Update - In the September 2005, High School Principal's Newsletter I briefly mentioned a computer program that Kalida High School is piloting for the D-A Site and we are getting ready to roll out the parent access version of that software.

The program is called Progress Book and it is a like a grade book program with many more components. It will allow us to do some wonderful things that will help increase the communication and flow of information between home and school. Students and parents will be able to access the program over the web and check on grades, homework, absences and get messages from the staff.

We have already had a few parents helping us test the program and work the bugs out of the Parent-Access part of the program, and are getting ready to make this available to all of our parents and students very soon. We are looking to roll this out to the entire high school in mid to late October, and we will have a demonstration of it during parent-teacher conferences in November.

Please remember that the sofware for this program is still being tested and the teachers are still learning to use this program. We are pleased with everyone's work as they begin posting this information to the web. However, some of it may not always be completely up-to-date or accurate as we continue to tweak the system and add options. It is a very powerful tool, and one that I know the parents of the district will appreciate. We hope to have it completely open and running shortly after Parent/Teacher conferences.

This program is the reason for the ten dollar technology fee on your student's book bill. We eliminated a number of class paper fees and combined those printer/printing costs with the internet access to the Progress Book program into one single fee which we called a technology fee.

Please watch for a mailing from the high school with your parent and student access codes. You will need these codes to log on to the system. When you receive this letter please do not share the parent access code with your student, and let us know if you have any questions or comments.

The Kalida Local Schools Library has its own library web site available on the Kalida Local Schools web page at: kalida.k12.oh.us From this library homepage site, you may access:

Students may conduct their research either from home or school. To reach the online research databases, go to the Kalida Local Schools homepage and click on *Library Resources*, click on *Online Research Resources*, then click on *Kalida Local Schools*. The password is: *research*. From this page you can access any of our online databases by clicking on the link in the column to the left and then typing in the correct User ID and Password (passwords are case sensitive) from the column on the right.

The other online databases available to students listed on the *Online Research Resources* page are from INFOhio and OPLIN/Putnam County District Library (all these databases are made available through federal and state monies.) The user ID and password to access the INFOhio databases are printed on a bookmark and available in the elementary and high school libraries. To access the resources through OPLIN/Putnam County District Library, you must have a library card and type in the 14-digit number listed on that card.
