SCHOOL AUCTION

The Kalida Local Schools Auction held on November 6 was a huge success for the district, the Lions Club, and the Athletic Boosters. The school district sold the old furniture and equipment that was no longer needed after we moved into the new buildings, as well as the district's single share of Kalida Telephone Stock, two school buses, and the modular classroom units. The auction was a great opportunity for the school district, the Lions Club and the Athletic boosters to work together to raise money for the school district and the new Kalida Park. The Lions Club and the Boosters club provided the concessions and auctioneers services, and the district coordinated the sale of school and consignment items for the auction. The auction brought in approximately \$38,000 in total sales, and the Lions Club and the Athletic Boosters will receive approximately \$8,000 to help fund the on-going construction projects in the park. The district's portion of the proceeds will be placed in the Permanent Improvement fund to offset the cost of renovations to the St. Michaels portion of the elementary building. I would like to thank all of the Lions Club and Athletic Boosters members, and school personnel who worked together to make this a great event.

SCHOOL FINANCE

As I did in the October Paw Print, I am going to continue to discuss the state budget and the impact it will have on school finances for the next few months. Governor-elect Kasich will probably unveil his plans for the next biennial budget sometime in March. The state of Ohio is currently projecting a deficit of between \$4 billion and \$8 billion dollars for the next biennial budget. The district and the state are dealing with the same issues that many of you are dealing with in your personal finances; falling incomes and increasing expenses. The state of Ohio went from an average of approximately a 3% increase in school funding per year for a long time, to flat funding last year and a 2% cut in funding for the 2010-2011 school year. We have also been informed that we should begin to plan for a possible 5% reduction in our current fiscal year budget and a 10-15% cut for the next biennial budget. The cuts we have been told to expect for the next biennial budget has increased from approximately 10% to a 10-15% range in only a little more than a month.

The proposed cuts will have a devastating effect on the finances of Kalida Local Schools. The most damaging cut may actually be a potential 5% cut in January to our current budget. The reason this type of cut is so damaging is because of the fact that the cut comes after budgets have been set, money has been encumbered, and contracts have been entered into for the current school year. If the 5% cut occurs it would be retroactive to July of 2010. The amount of money the district would stand to lose through these cuts is significant. A 5% cut in our current budget would amount to a loss of almost \$129,000. The proposed 10% cut next year would mean an additional \$258,000 loss in funding, while a 15% cut would force the district to cut \$386,000 from the budget.

As was stated in the October Paw Print over the last six years the district has reduced the teaching staff by eliminating seven positions and non-certified staff by eliminating three positions. The district has added a position to teach our biomedical science courses, and a grant funded special education position in that same time frame. The district has also reduced hours for other employees taking some of them from full time to part time status. With a tentative agreement waiting to be signed by the teachers union, another step the district has taken to control costs is to limit all personnel (teachers, administrators, and non-certified staff) to a 0% base pay raise for the 2010 – 2011 school year. The Kalida Board of Education also worked out contracts with the superintendent and treasurer for a 0% base pay raise during the 2009 – 2010 school year.

The district continues to strive to be fiscally responsible, and the district spends over \$1600 less per student than the state average. In spite of spending much less than the state average, our results are among the best of any district in the state, and we are one of a handful of districts who have earned an Excellent rating from the Ohio Department of Education for ten consecutive years.

Financial Aid Night for Senior Parents and Students - The FAFSA or Free Application For Student Assistance is the governmental form which must be filled out by the student and his/her parents in order to determine the student's eligibility for financial aid. Many colleges and universities also require that it be filled out if a student wishes to be considered for funds (scholarships) that the respective schools distribute. Applying online for the FAFSA is faster and more accurate. Beginning January 1 for this year's seniors, parents and students can access the application at www.fafsa.ed.gov. What can you do right now? Parents and students can apply for a pin number which will be your electronic signature for the FAFSA. The student and at least one parent need a pin. You can obtain this at www.pin.ed.gov. Every year a financial seminar is held at one of the area participating schools. This year it will be held at Kalida on January 10 from 6:30 - 8 p.m. in high school auditoria. A representative from a local college's financial aid department will be present to explain the proper procedure for filling out the Free Application for Student Aid. Parents of juniors are also encouraged to attend if they wish to get a head start on the college process. There are a couple of other financial aid nights coming up in our area. Click on that box to view the scholarships – paying particular attention to the criteria which a student must possess in order to be eligible to apply. This listing will be updated at least once a month and "new release scholarships" that were not present on the previous listing will be marked in boldface print.
