LEADING COUNTY SCHOOLS IN UNITED WAY DONATIONS AGAIN!

We would like to thank and congratulate our staff on being recognized as a leader in raising money for the United Way of Putnam County. Our district staff raised more money per employee than any other school district in the county for the second year in a row. We had 100 percent certified and administrative staff participation, and 79 percent classified staff participation. The employees of the district donated a total of \$1,759 to United Way. Thanks to our staff members for giving back to the county and district residents by supporting the valuable services provided by United Way of Putnam County. Executive Director, Jeanne Beutler, presented the district with a plaque recognizing the efforts of our staff.

RACE TO THE TOP

The district continues to work on new state initiatives as a part of the Race to the Top (RttT) grant program. Our Race to the Top Transformation Team recently met with Nancy Wood-Allison from the Ohio Department of Education to review district progress in implementing the initiatives outlined in our RttT Scope of Work.

The district staff has been making great strides in meeting the goals of the RttT Grant, and as a result of the progress review, our professional development for the remainder of the year will focus on three areas. The first area of focus will be preparing for implementation of the Common Core curriculum, and the resulting PARCC assessments our students will be taking. Our second area of focus will be exploring additional ways to build a collaborative culture among staff, students, parents, and the community. We will continue to investigate new ways to improve communication among all of these groups through the more efficient use of technology. The final area of focus will be training to help our teaching staff prepare for the implementation and use of Student Learning Objectives and Student Growth Measures.

This work is a part of an ongoing four year grant through the Ohio Department of Education and the U.S. Department of Education. The money from the grant has allowed the district to provide high quality professional development to prepare the staff and students for the curricular and assessment changes which are being implemented. The grant funding has also allowed the district to start our 1:1 iPad Initiative at the high school, with the goal of improving our student's access and familiarity with technology. This is especially important as the new assessments are implemented, because the Ohio Department of Education is planning to have these new assessments administered online. The hope is that these trainings and initiatives will give our students a leg up on many other students across Ohio as the new assessments are implemented.

Parents of seniors who will be attending college next fall are reminded to complete the Free Application for Student Assistance (FAFSA). The FAFSA is the governmental form which must be filled out by the student and his/her parent(s) in order to determine the student's eligibility for financial aid. Many colleges and universities also require that it be filled out if a student wishes to be considered for funds or scholarships that the respective schools distribute. Beginning January 1 for this year's seniors, parents and students can access the application at www.fafsa.ed.gov What can you do right now? Parents and students can apply for a pin number which will be your electronic signature for the FAFSA. The student and at least one parent must have a pin number. You can obtain this at www.pin.ed.gov A good goal for completion of the FAFSA is mid-February. Parents and students are highly encouraged to call a college's financial aid office or check their websites for these dates.

Juniors: Don't Forget the ACT!!

Parents of juniors are encouraged to remind their students to register and take the ACT at least 2 – 3 times before their senior year. The ACT is one of the two college entrance exams – the other being the SAT - required by most schools for admission. The ACT is the more dominant of the two for schools in Ohio and the Midwest. However, colleges will accept either test. The ACT is offered 6 times a year Remaining tests for this school year are in February, April, and June. The deadline to register for the test in February is January 10. Students must register online at www.actstudent.org. Fee waivers for the ACT are available in the guidance office for students who may qualify because of financial need. One new requirement which began year is that each student must upload a picture of himself or herself into the online account. Upon completing the registration, a student must print out a registration ticket with his or her photo on it. This form along with another form of picture ID (driver's license, etc.) must be taken to the test site in order to be permitted to test.

Recycling at KHS

This year, Foreign Language Club has taken the initiative to start KHS Recycles at the high school. They have purchased blue bins to go in every classroom, the library, teacher's lounge and cafeteria. The high school will begin recycling paper, plastic bottles, aluminum cans and metal cans (in the kitchen) starting late December. Members from the *Foreign Language Club* and *Cats Who Care* have volunteered to collect the recyclables every Wednesday during activity period as well as transport the recyclables to the Putnam County recycling bins on Rt. 114 at the beginning of each month. With the help of FLC & CWC members as well as the staff and students, the KHS Recycles program is expected to be a great success and divert a lot of trash from the landfill.

We hope this program will educate our students and community about the benefits and importance of recycling as well as encourage our staff and students to work together to make this a success. On December 18, a short video created on the school iPads by FLC & CWC members, will air at the high school to explain exactly how the program will work. We hope to make this video available on the KHS Facebook page for community members to view as well! Go Green!
