Please check the information below for the method to access the application. **Most are available online or have been loaded into Schoology.** Following each scholarship, there is a letter which indicates whether it is sponsored by a local, state, or national organization.(L=Local, S=State, N=National.) Students should apply first for local and state scholarships since the odds of winning are usually better. **It is important to note that these are not the only scholarship opportunities that exist. They are the only the ones that are mailed or sent to the high school. Students are highly encouraged to access scholarship search sites on the internet for other possibilities.
